ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

Authors should submit abstracts electronically to the 2006 ASEE GSW Technical Sessions Chair, Dr. Hamid Majlesein at: hamid@engr.subr.edu. Abstracts should be 250-300 words.

ABSTRACT ONLY SUBMISSION

If you would like to participate, but cannot meet the paper submission deadlines, you can present your talk and have only your abstract published in the proceedings. Note that you will still be required to register for the conference and submit an abstract, as described below. When submitting your abstract, please indicate that it is an abstract only submission.

SUBMISSION OF FULL PAPERS

See the [Author's Kit](#) for formatting guidelines. Only authors of accepted abstracts can submit full manuscripts for review. Papers will be accepted on the basis of peer review. Accepted papers will be published in the conference proceedings on a CD. Final papers must be submitted via email (PDF or MS Word format only) to the ASEE GSW Technical Sessions Chair, Dr. Hamid Majlesein at hamid@engr.subr.edu

STUDENT TECHNICAL PAPERS

ASEE-GSW is also seeking student technical papers in any engineering discipline. The e-mail message accompanying the submission of a student abstract/paper should clearly indicate that the principal author is a student (since papers of a purely technical nature will not be accepted from non-students).

IMPORTANT DEADLINES

- Abstracts due: December 5, 2005
- Review of abstracts completed and authors notified: December 20, 2005
- Full manuscripts due: January 31, 2006
- Reviews completed and comments to authors: February 20, 2006
- Final Papers due: March 1, 2006
- Pre-registration: March 1, 2006
- Registration (with late fee): March 11, 2006

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to make a presentation and have your paper (or abstract) appear on the proceedings CD, your registration fee must be paid by the March 1 deadline.
